

LARGE ITEM COLLECTION (RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES ONLY)

- Collection occurs on **your collection day** during the week specified on your collection schedule. Items are to be placed curbside no earlier than Sunday of Large Item Collection Week (May 24th & September 13th).
- Scrap metal & Non-Freon appliances, Freon appliances and Electronics must be placed in separate piles as they are collected separately for recycling.
- Small items or material placed out in garbage bags or cardboard boxes WILL NOT BE collected.
- Remove all fluids, gasoline from items (i.e. lawn mower). Remove batteries from **ALL** items.
- Material must be manageable by two (2) people and cannot exceed 80 lbs (36kg), 27ft³ (.76m³) or 6 ft (1.8 m).

HSW MATERIAL ACCEPTED

(Containers 5 gallon (20L) or smaller)

Ensure HSW is in the original or a well-marked container to indicate the contents. Containers must be properly sealed with no visible leaks. Unlabeled/ unidentified products cannot be accepted.

Helium tanks (single use)

Light bulbs (fluorescent, incandescent, LED) Mercury thermometers & switches

Needles, syringes, lancets (packaged in a sealed plastic container or sharps container OR return to local pharmacy)

Oil, oil filters & empty oil containers

Propane cylinders Pesticides & herbicides

Small businesses must receive pre-approval before bringing HSW - visit ovwrc.com to download application forms.

Please bring small loads of household hazardous waste to the depot. Large loads may not be accepted ½ hour before

closing. If a load consists of a combination of solid and auid hazardous waste, the total of the wastes cannot Tires are NOT collected curbside. exceed 90 kg/litres per load. Individual es (passenger & light truck tires, containers/pails cannot exceed 20 L (5 gallon).

DO NOT throw these items in garbage or recycling.



Christmas Tree collection – week of January 4th on your regular collection day

All waste streams to be set-out by 6:30 a.m. for collection. Material must be placed 5 to 6 feet (1.5 to 1.8 m) from curb or roadside (in driveway, not on sidewalk or snow bank). Green cart must have 2 to 3 feet (0.6 to 0.9 m) clearance around it to allow for proper collection and with wheels facing away from the road with the lid closed. Containers cannot exceed 50 lbs (23kg) (with the exception of the green cart).

or other open top, reusable container (i.e. laundry basket, Rubbermaid container, etc.)

Recyclables must be placed loose inside your yellow bin

Residential recycling in plastic bags WILL NOT be collected.

ENSURE ITEMS ARE EMPTY AND FREE FROM FOOD RESIDUE

Do not include alcoholic beverage containers. Return all eligible liquor, wine, and beer containers for a refund at an Ontario Deposit Return Program location.

Plastic containers (lids on) Laundry detergent and

household cleaner jugs, shampoo, body wash, salad dressing condiment, dish soap, mouth wash bottles,

plastic beverage bottles. Food trays, salad, yogurt, peanut butter, bakery and egg containers, plastic cups, plastic tubs and lids. Toothpaste tubes, deodorant, hand cream tubes, small item

packaging, hand sanitizer bottles, plant pots.

Metal Food cans, metal lids, cookie, coffe and tea tins,

beverage cans.

Glass containers

Clear and coloured alass. Food containers, iars and bottles. cosmetic containers, spice bottles, oil and vinegar bottles, non-alcoholic glass beverage containers. Lids off.

Aerosol containers

Food sprays, hair spray, air fresheners, shaving cream

deodorant. Lids on.

LEAF & YARD WASTE (L&YW)

Extra L&YW will ONLY be collected on specific days. Check your schedule for the L&YW symbol.

✓ ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

✓ Leaves ✓ Branches ✓ House & garden plants ✓ Garden/hedge/tree trimmings

ndividual branches must be no more than 2" (5 cm) in diameter or 4 ft (1.2 m) in length. Bundled branches must be no more than 2 ft (0.60 m) in diameter. Individual bag/bundle/container cannot

exceed 50 lbs (23 kgs). Use open top, reusable containers, cardboard boxes, or paper yard waste bags.

Material in plastic bags will not be collected.

L&YW is collected separately from other materials. Green carts will only be collected on green cart collection days.

Leaves & Grass Clippings (loose or in paper bags) accepted at OVWRC, no charge. Fees apply for Mixed Leaf & Yard Waste, Branches, Tree Limbs and Stumps.

LEAF & YARD WASTE

Paper recycling must be placed loose in a blue box, cardboard box, paper bag or other reusable open top container.

Residential recycling in plastic bags WILL NOT be collected (with the exception of shredded paper).
